Public Hearing

Town Manager Wedemeyer lets the Council know that the Public Hearing is for the final adoption of the FY 19/20 budget. TM Wedemeyer would like to compliment John at the Pioneer for the very good article on the last Public Hearing. TM Wedemeyer explains that our biggest revenue is Sales Tax. The Town of Parker does not have Property Tax; the residents only pay to La Paz County. TM Wedemeyer then breaks down the expenditures for this fiscal year. Our biggest expenditures are the remodel at 1112 Arizona Ave, the street project for Chemehuevi, Desert and Eagle; new water service truck and asphalt for the Senior Center and Library parking lots.

The Mayor then asks for any comments and there are none.

1. Approve/Deny One-year extension of Republic Services Agreement for solid waste collection.

Interim PW Director Ziegler informs the Council of a one year service agreement extension from August 2019 -August 2020. We can extend this agreement one year at a time. The terms and conditions will remain the same and the rate schedule will also remain the same. Wedemeyer announces the Matt Cross and Rita Cucci from Republic Services are here. TM Wedemeyer also lets the Council know that Republic is offering a multi-year contract, however the attorney says to go one year at a time. Mr. Cross compliments Parker and says that if we wish to do a longer contract, they are in agreeance. They are not in it to make money, just to service the community. CM Bonds says they will set a work session to discuss a multi-year agreement

Interim PW Director Ziegler tells of a seven year agreement that began in July 2014. We are currently in the 6th year. The rate is currently \$13.09 for one tote and will be going to \$13.35. A Public Hearing will be held and then will hopefully be adopted on the September 3rd Council Meeting. They are fair and frugal increases; we are not trying to break the bank.

The increases are in increments so as not to gouge the customers. Customers will notice an increase of 3% or \$.27 per month that will go into effect after the September 3rd meeting. The Resolution and postings are a legal requirement. We must give a 60 day notice before raising any rates.

CM Savino also reports on the Chamber Board. They had a discussion on the Tube Float. There were lower floaters this year. There were no major issues or complaints about left over trash. They do not have official numbers as of yet.

CM Savino reports on the WACOG Board as well. They went through the budget and audit. They approved the Senior Center Congregate and Home Delivered Meals Program.

CM Savino also discusses the Council on Aging. They had discussion on the services provided to our area seniors.

Town Manager Wedemeyer lets the Council know that adoption of the budget does not mean the agreements are adopted as well. Just because the money is in the budget, does not mean it has to be spent.

MOTION: Approve the Tentative Adoption of Fiscal Year 2019-2020 Budget of \$17,748,761 to include the following:
Capital Projects for the Town in the amount of \$8,117,752, including \$292,002 from GADA loan and \$6,500,000 from grant funding.

Chamber of Commerce, Tourism, and LaPaz Economic Development will be funded as follows: \$48,000 for Chamber and Tourism, and \$30,000 for Economic Development. Both Chamber and Economic Development will have a performance agreement to sign before any QUARTERLY distributions will occur.

Other Community Partners will remain the same as in FY2018/2019.

Employees will receive a 3% COLA.
